Chair Report (Susan Singh)

• There are currently 105 active volunteers

• Processes have been established by the museum to accurately identify active volunteers eligible for volunteer benefits

Highlights of the Museum Board Meeting (Sandra Kuzniak)

- The rent increase at 401 has been approved by the Museum Board of Directors

- The Museum is negotiating the acquisition of a collection of Navajo Rugs

• Additional docents are still needed.

• We're finding the Telling Stories exhibit a little difficult to tour as the focus is on the stories rather than the textiles.

Educators (Julia Bryant)

• School bookings have increased, but are down over last year. College tours have increased over last year. Tours are being combined with the Textile City tours.

• Activity boxes continue to be developed.

The educators will be participating in a calligraphy course at Harbourfront.

Human Resources (Laura Brocklebank)

• Continue to interview for the shop, docents and reception

• The process of recruiting and streamlining the interview process is in progress

Library (Vickie Grant)

• On October 8th, we hosted a tour of retired librarians from the group Ex Libris. We had two groups of about 10 each. Brenda Taylor and Susan Helwig made presentations, assisted by Vickie.

• Our main activity when we are not serving the public is to continue the work of de-accessioning duplicate copies. The staff will be offered these duplicates for the Fourth Floor, and those not wanted will be sent to the shop, to our own book sale during the Yardage sale, to other libraries, or to book heaven.

• The remainders from Redesign are currently on sale in the shop
