- March was a busy month. Fibrespace was staffed by volunteers every afternoon during March break March 8th to 17th from 1.00 4.00 and the program was well attended. Over the course of the week we had 85 children and their caregivers participate in our hands-on program.

- 5 educators continue to meet with Susan to work on the activity boxes, including making samples to demonstrate various craft techniques, including knitting, weaving, cross-stitch and various forms of embellishments.

#### Shop (Helen Kirkby)

- Inventory was successfully completed
- Sales are up 18% for the year
- The computer has been installed in the shop

### Fourth Floor (Arlette Schulman)

- The shelves at the end of the Permanent Gallery have been changed to complement Natalia's show "Shine".
- 50 pieces of lace from our lace collection were pulled for viewing by a group of lace makers in first week of April.
- Artifacts were mounted during the month of February, and right up to the last minute in March for the show "Shine"
